EA Education Requirement: 72 hours education per enrollment period (3 years) which consist of a minimum of 16 hours education annually and a minimum of 2 hours ethics courses annually.

CRTP Education Requirement: 20 hours education annually which consist of 15 hours IRS approved education (10 hours federal tax law, 3 hours federal tax law update, 2 hours ethics) AND an additional 5 hours California tax law.

AFSP Education Requirement: 18 Hours education annually which consists of a 6 Hour Annual Federal Tax Refresher (AFTR) Course & Test, 10 Hours Federal Tax Law and 2 Hours Ethics. Preparers currently registered with CTEC (California), OBTP (Oregon) and MSBITP (Maryland) are exempt from the AFSP requirements

New! Beginning with Tax Year 2018, California Corporate and S-Corporate Estimated Tax Payments can now be transmitted electronically through the Estimated Tax Wizard.

This means that CA estimated payments will NO LONGER be transmitted with the filing of the tax return for these filing types.

If you weren't aware of this during tax season, you may want to return to any clients filed and double check that the estimates have been correctly filed.

A Story for You This May

Peter Property Owner came in late this year to do his tax return, and now in addition to all his rentals he tells you he did a 1031 exchange last year. No problem! You took a CE course last summer about all things 1031, right?

Pete hands you his document, including his "Buyer's Final Closing" for the exchange property, and you see the new home is NOT in California... ugh. You remember hearing something in that course about California's new rule to track exchanged properties outside of the state – and now you've got some research to do.

No worries, it's not difficult. Report the 1031 on the tax return, then each year file Form 3840 "California Like-Kind Exchanges" until the property is disposed of in a taxable transaction. (By the way, I found out this past tax season Form 3840 <u>must be signed by the taxpayer</u> and either mailed or filed electronically with FTB... read the next article!)

What's that you say? This is the first you've heard of this California Form 3840?

Again, no worries. Ruth Godfrey of the CSTC Inland Empire Chapter will be presenting a 4-hour CE course on all things 1031 this coming summer for the Greater Long Beach Chapter. This "Extension Session" will be followed up by the GLB regular Evening Educational Event – a 2-Hour CE course covering 'how to get the 1031 into the Federal and California tax returns.'

Greater Long Beach is trying something new this year! We're offering four "Extension Sessions" throughout the year, followed by a separate 2-Hour Evening Educational Event which will show you how to take what you learned and get it into the tax returns. SHOUT OUT TO FTB!

I have to give this shout out to FTB, and it begins with: "My client got a letter..."

I couldn't believe it. I looked and looked over the letter; I read it at least a dozen times. "Why??" I asked myself. "Why did he get this letter? I filed the form??" My heart ached; sigh.

I checked my software; the form FTB said they didn't get was there – all 3 years it was there!

I finally resolved myself to call FTB – just call – this must be a simple mistake, I know I completed the required form each year on a timely filed tax return. So call FTB Practitioner Priority Line I did.

Sure enough, I completed the form – but this particular form 'just happened to be' one of the very few forms which does not eFile with the return. Each year it needs to be printed separately and mailed into FTB as a standalone form.

The young man I spoke with was so very understanding, so calm – unlike me, so worried! He said it wasn't a problem and that, yes, I needed to have the client sign it and mail it in each year. *He also noted that it could be signed by the taxpayer and eFiled with the return as "an attachment" – but oh my that sounded complicated!* Seems *each year there is just so much for us to learn as tax professionals!*

So shout out to FTB for their understanding and calm nature when speaking with a distraught tax professional during the Ides of March! You guys and gals rock!

Oh, the form to be mailed in??? Greater Long Beach has two WONDERFUL Extension Sessions coming up early this summer in June and July – California is the June topic, Like Kind Exchanges is the July topic. Mark your calendars and plan to join us and I guarantee you'll learn all about this standalone form which does NOT eFile.
