IR-2025-38, March 28, 2025 — The Earned Income Tax Credit has played a crucial role in helping millions of low-to-moderate income workers out of poverty. Saturday, March 29, 2025, marks the 50th anniversary of this important credit.

IRS: Free File provides quick and easy way to file taxes

IR-2025-37, March 25, 2025 — As the end of tax season approaches, the Internal Revenue Service reminds taxpayers that IRS Free File is a quick and easy way to file federal tax returns for free.

Follow key filing guidelines to speed refunds, avoid errors

IR-2025-36, March 24, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service issued a series of tips and reminders to speed taxpayer refunds and avoid errors on their federal tax returns as the April 15 filing deadline approaches.

IRS-CI names Gary Shapley as deputy chief

IR-2025-35, March 19, 2025 — Gary Shapley has been named deputy chief for IRS Criminal Investigation (IRS-CI), starting March 19. In his new role, Shapley will oversee 20 field offices and 14 foreign posts, including more than 2,000 special agents investigating tax fraud and other financial crimes.

IRS: West Virginia storm victims qualify for tax relief; various deadlines postponed to Nov. 3

IR-2025-34, March 14, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service announced today tax relief for individuals and businesses in parts of West Virginia affected by severe storms, straight-line winds, flooding, landslides and mudslides that began on Feb. 15, 2025.

IRS reminds retirees: April 1 final day to begin required withdrawals from IRAs and 401(k)s

IR-2025-33, March 13, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service issued a reminder today that in most cases retirees who turned 73 in 2024 must begin receiving payments from Individual Retirement Arrangements (IRAs), 401(k)s and similar workplace retirement plans by Tuesday, April 1, 2025.

Tax Time Guide: Use IRS electronic payment options for fast, safe service; avoid penalties and interest

IR-2025-32, March 12, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service today encouraged taxpayers to file a tax return or pay taxes they owe using electronic options on IRS.gov by April 15.

<u>Taxpayers should act now to claim more than \$1 billion in refunds for tax year 2021 with the April 15 deadline fast</u> <u>approaching</u> IR-2025-31, March 11, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service announced today that over 1.1 million people across the nation have unclaimed refunds for tax year 2021 but face an April 15 deadline to submit their tax returns.

IRS: Don't overlook free options for preparing and filing taxes in 2025; Direct File available in 25 states

IR-2025-30, March 10, 2025 — The IRS encouraged taxpayers who have yet to prepare and file their tax returns to consider taking advantage of the many free options available – including Direct File, a free, fast and easy way to file directly with the IRS, now available in 25 states.

Interest rates remain the same for the second quarter of 2025

IR-2025-29, March 6, 2025 — The Internal Revenue Service today announced interest rates will remain the same for the calendar quarter beginning April 1, 2025.
